North Shore Water Update – February 2026

The Water Authority of the North Shore (WANS) was created through New York State legislation signed into law in 2021 to evaluate public water supply options for North Shore communities. The six-member WANS Board is appointed by the City of Glen Cove, the Town of Oyster Bay, and the Villages of Old Brookville, Roslyn Harbor, and Sea Cliff. WANS does not currently operate any water system. Residents should continue to contact their existing water provider regarding service and billing.

Quick Status

- WANS is advancing through the Public Service Commission's eight-step process.
- The Authority is currently in Step 5: Negotiation.
- Updates are shared to the extent permitted by law.
